COURSE LISTINGS

(1) Flashover Recognition and Survival is a basic level course created and adopted with the goal of improving firefighter recognition and survival techniques for rapid fire progression and related events. The "Awareness" level course is lecture based and topics include but are not limited to: Basic fire behavior and fire development, potential signs, elements, and indicators of Flashover and Backdraft; tactical ventilation and survival techniques. Relevant case studies may also be discussed during this course. *This course is required for certification.*

(2) Wildland FF Awareness is required for certification of those that had (0) training hours as of July 1, 2001. It is based on the S-130 and S-190 courses, but takes into account specific information related to Kentucky. It is a lecture-based class focused on the topics of fire behavior, tools, equipment, suppression, urban interface, and Wildland firefighting safety. *This course is required for certification.*

(3) Instructor Methodology Update is designed for company officers and other fire or rescue service personnel with the responsibility of conducting periodic company level or small unit training, introduces the participant to basic instructional concepts and techniques. Emphasis is on teaching principles and techniques applicable to fire and rescue service training and includes effective communication, teaching from lesson plans, methods of instruction, with emphasis on skills training and adult learning. *This class meets the methodology requirement for instructor bi-annual recertification.*

(4) Healthcare Provider CPR/AED is a class that is taught to the American Heart Association standards for Healthcare Providers. All new firefighters are required to have this class for certification. *There is a \$10.00 charge for the certification card payable after completion of the class. The student will also need to bring a CPR pocket mask to participate in this class. If needed, the pocket masks will be available for purchase for \$15.00.*

(5) Firefighter Survival will emphasize removal of trapped or unconscious firefighters from a burning building and self-rescue techniques when the primary escape route is blocked. *This is a required course for all new firefighters effective 7/1/2000. Full turnout gear and SCBA are required.*

(6) Firefighter Rescue is designed to teach the firefighter how to rescue victims from a burning structure. Special techniques are used for rescue. This course will test your skills to the limit. *This is a required course for all new firefighters effective 7/1/2001. The student must have taken the FF Survival Course before taking the FF Rescue Course. Full turnout gear and SCBA are required.*

(7) Basic Firefighting Skills is a two day class with both classroom and hands-on learning. Students will cover Fire Investigation, Fire Behavior, Building Construction, Salvage & Overhaul, and Search & Rescue. The Max Fire Box and King Props will also be used for hands-on skills. Classes are broken into 3 hour segments which meets the 150 hour certification requirements. *All students will need full PPE, including SCBA and a spare bottle.*

(8) Hazmat Operations is a two day class that will cover both classroom and hands-on training in Hazmat response. Students will be placed in Level A suits learning skills essential to Hazmat response. Scenarios will play a major portion of this class including decontamination. *Students will need an SCBA and extra bottle for the course. No beards will be permitted for this class.*

(9) Engine Company Operations is a two day intense hands-on class that will challenge even the veteran firefighter. Subjects covered will be hose handling, fire attack, ventilation, forcible entry, and search and rescue. Students will be challenged every step of the way in this class so be prepared to work and learn. Full PPE including SCBA and an extra bottle is required this course. **A Live Fire Competency Validation Form MUST be completed in full and given to the Lead Instructor prior to participation in the Live Fire portions of this class. This form is available on our website at www.sfrt10.com on the Registration page for the school or you can contact our SFRT10 office for the form.**

(10) High Angle Rope Rescue is a two day intense hands-on class that will provide the student with exposure to the rules, principles, and tools necessary to access and remove a victim that is stranded in a high angle environment. This will be a total hands-on class that will move at a fast pace. **All students will need a rock helmet, swift water helmet, USAR helmet OR fire helmet; rope gloves, extrication gloves OR any leather type gloves, (no fire gloves permitted); closed toe boots, (no sneakers or fire boots permitted).**

(11) Traumatic Injury Extrication is a two day intense hands-on class that will be interesting and challenging for all firefighters and EMS from the newest member to the veteran officer. We will take the student into a world of incidents ranging from impalements and entanglements with machinery, simple ring cutting/removal, removing someone stuck in a swing, along with many other scenarios in between. This class will cover and practice techniques that will apply to these calls that we all dread. The student will be using many different types of hand tools, electric tools, and air tools. **All students will need a helmet, gloves and eye protection.**

(12) Leadership I for Fire and EMS: Strategies for Company Success is a two day course designed to meet the needs of the Fire/Emergency medical services (EMS) Officer and provides the participant with basic skills and tools needed to perform effectively as a leader in the fire service environment. It also addresses ethics, use and abuse of power at the Fire/EMS Officer level, creativity in the fire service environment, and managing the multiple roles of the Fire/EMS Officer.

Any class with fewer than 10 students will be cancelled one week prior to the school. Please call either number listed below or email mark.hammond@kctcs.edu to verify the class is still scheduled.

This is a FREE school to anyone belonging to the Eastern Kentucky Firefighters Association. If you are not a member, there will be a \$10.00 fee per person to attend.
