COURSE LISTINGS

(1) Flashover Recognition and Survival is a basic level course created and adopted with the goal of improving firefighter recognition and survival techniques for rapid fire progression and related events. The "Awareness" level course is lecture based and topics include but are not limited to: Basic fire behavior and fire development, potential signs, elements, and indicators of Flashover and Backdraft; tactical ventilation and survival techniques. Relevant case studies may also be discussed during this course. *This course is required for certification.* *OPEN TO JR. FIREFIGHTERS
FRIDAY NIGHT ONLY

(2) Wildland Firefighting Awareness is required for certification of those that had (0) training hours as of July 1, 2001. It is based on the S-130 and S-190 courses, but takes into account specific information related to Kentucky. It is a lecture-based class focused on the topics of fire behavior, tools, equipment, suppression, urban interface, and Wildland firefighting safety. *This course is required for certification.* *OPEN TO JR. FIREFIGHTERS
FRIDAY NIGHT ONLY

(3) Instructor Methodology Update is designed for company officers and other fire or rescue service personnel with the responsibility of conducting periodic company level or small unit training, introduces the participant to basic instructional concepts and techniques. Emphasis is on teaching principles and techniques applicable to fire and rescue service training and includes effective communication, teaching from lesson plans, methods of instruction, with emphasis on skills training and adult learning. *This class meets the methodology requirement for instructor bi-annual recertification.* *OPEN TO JR. FIREFIGHTERS
FRIDAY NIGHT ONLY

(4) Fire Service Suicide Intervention & Prevention – Every year we lose more firefighters to suicide than to line of duty deaths. This class is designed to understand the stress, pressure, and culture of the fire service that can lead to suicidal ideation and is open to anyone in emergency services and their families. *Course Objectives: Develop strategies to train personnel in suicide prevention, recognize the importance of establishing department policy and procedures, identify suicidal behaviors and communications.* *OPEN TO JR. FIREFIGHTERS **FRIDAY NIGHT ONLY**

(5) Firefighter Survival will emphasize removal of trapped or unconscious firefighters from a burning building and self-rescue techniques when the primary escape route is blocked. *This is a required course for all new firefighters effective 7/1/2000. Full turnout gear and SCBA are required.* *OPEN TO JR. FIREFIGHTERS
SATURDAY ONLY

(6) Traumatic Injury Extrication is an intense hands-on class that will be interesting and challenging for all firefighters and EMS from the newest member to the veteran officer. We will take the student into a world of incidents ranging from impalements and entanglements with machinery, simple ring cutting/removal, removing someone stuck in a swing, along with many other scenarios in between. This class will cover and practice techniques that will apply to these calls that we all dread. The student will be using many different types of hand tools, electric tools, and air tools. *All students will need a helmet, gloves and eye protection.* **SATURDAY ONLY**

(7) Forcible Entry is a class that will show the firefighter how to recognize bolt patterns on doors, different locks from pad locks to high security locks, the proper way to force doors, force pad locks and force hinges on doors. Truly a hands-on, learn by doing class. *Full PPE with eye protection is required.* *OPEN TO JR. FIREFIGHTERS
SATURDAY ONLY

(8) Firefighter Rescue is designed to teach the firefighter how to rescue victims from a burning structure. Special techniques are used for rescue. This course will test your skills to the limit. ***This is a required course for all new firefighters effective 7/1/2001. The student must have taken the FF Survival Course before taking the FF Rescue Course. Full turnout gear and SCBA are required.***

SUNDAY ONLY

(9) NFPA 1403 Live Fire Training-Houseburn is a class for the advanced firefighter with a day of live fire training using an acquired structure. This class will cover all aspects of fire control following NFPA 1403 and 1500. ***All students will need full protective clothing, including SCBA and an extra bottle. You must be clean shaven to participate in this class. Mustaches are permitted. A Live Fire Competency Validation Form signed by the Chief Officer of your department which states that you have met all the NFPA Firefighter I Job Performance requirements MUST be completed in full and given to the Lead Instructor prior to participation in this class. This form is available on our website at www.sfirt10.com on the Registration page for the school or you can contact our SFRT10 office for the form.***

SUNDAY ONLY

(10) Basic Firefighting consists of hands on and classroom training and covers 16 of the 20 recommended hours for a new firefighter in Kentucky. ***Open to Ages 15 and up.***

Safety-B0000 (2hrs)
PPE-F0000 (3hrs)

Fire Behavior-D0000 (3hrs)
Hose/Nozzles/Appliances-K0000 (3hrs)

Extinguishers-E0000 (3hrs)
Fire Control-M0000 (2hrs)

Students will need full PPE and SCBA. *OPEN TO JR. FIREFIGHTERS

SAT/SUN

(11) Incident Safety Officer is the National Fire Academy's Incident Safety Officer class. This course examines the Safety Officer's role at emergency responses. A specific focus on operations within an Incident Command System (ICS) as a Safety Officer is a main theme. Response to all hazardous types of situations will be emphasized. ***No equipment or prerequisites are required.***

SAT/SUN

Jr. Firefighters can participate in the classes indicated if your department has a Jr. FF program. Jr. FF Program Training and Emergency Contact Information Forms MUST be completed and signed in full and given to the Lead Instructor of the class prior to participation. These forms are available on our website at www.sfirt10.com on the Registration page for the school or you can contact our SFRT10 office for these forms.

Any class with fewer than 10 students will be cancelled one week prior to the school. Please call either number listed below to verify the class is still scheduled.

This is a FREE school to anyone belonging to the Eastern Kentucky Firefighters Association. If you are not a member, there will be a \$10.00 fee per person to attend.
